In 2020, the Catholic convert recorded two Christian hip-hop albums — "It's Time" and "Stories of the Saints."

ROB REYNOLDS is a born entrepreneur. Studio 3:16's co-founder is a former school teacher and real estate developer who co-founded Avesta, a Tampa-based multifamily real estate investment and management company, in 2010. He helped grow Avesta to 450 employees and \$1.7 billion in real estate assets.
