Leaving Pride Behind is an initiative to raise awareness that people are not 'born gay.'

Millions of people around the world have shed their LGBTQ identity.

Not only have millions left Pride behind, but so has the U.S. Federal Government. In May, White House spokesperson Karoline Leavitt announced that the Trump Administration would not recognize Pride Month. Google also dropped Pride Month from its calendar.

"The Ruth Institute is celebrating those who have left Pride behind. We encourage all who believe people are 'born gay' to look at the scientific evidence. According to our research, there are more 'ex-gays' than 'gays!' During June, listen to the testimonies of those who took this journey away from an LGBT identity," said Jennifer Roback Morse, Ph.D., founder and president of The Ruth Institute.

Dr. Morse and other experts are available to the media in June to speak on the shift away from celebrating Pride Month and the false idea that those with same-sex attraction have no choice but to embrace an LGBT identity.

lived a duplicitous life, acting out homosexually

Desert Stream/Living Waters provides a pastoral application of Pope St. John Paul II's Theology of the Body, helping men and women who experience sexual and relational brokenness to aspire to chastity.



REV. ELIZABETH WONING (Co-Director, CHANGED Movement) attended a seminary as openly lesbian before. Her faith led her to healing and restoration in her sexuality. She co-founded the Changed

Movement, a community of friends who once identified as LGBTQ. Her work focuses on the intersection of faith with the culture of same-sex sexuality and gender identity. She advocates for the legal rights of Christians to abandon LGBTQ and align with their biological sex. She is happily married to her husband, Doug.
